Chizoba Egbuonu is a Risk Specialist in the Asset Management Policy Group in the Market Risk Division of the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency in Washington, D.C. The OCC's Asset Management Group establishes regulatory policy for the asset management products and services offered by national banks and federal savings associations. These include fiduciary activities, investment management and investment advisory services, unique and hard-to-value assets, collective investment funds, retirement plan products and services, private banking and wealth management, securities lending, custody, and the retail sale of nondeposit investment products. Chizoba provides policy guidance to national bank and thrift examiners, senior agency management, and to bankers, bank counsel, and colleagues at other Federal and state regulatory agencies. Chizoba primarily focuses on employer-sponsored retirement plans and IRA issues. Prior to joining the OCC, Chizoba worked as an employee benefits attorney at a large employment law firm.

Chizoba has represented the Asset Management Group and the OCC at banking, and fiduciary conferences and seminars.
